This house is made of mud.
You can see this house in Africa.
Africa is a very hot continent.
The mud bricks are thick.
The house is cool in summer and warm in winter.
This is a log house.
It's made of wood.
It's very strong and warm .
You can see it in Norway, Finland, Sweden, Estonia, Russia and Canada.
This is a traditional Japanese house.
It's made of wood .
It has bamboo or special paper walls to divide the rooms.
People sit on special mats "tatami" on the floor.
This is an underground house in Andalucia (Spain).
Its name is "la Cueba".
It's made of rock.
The house is cool in summer and warm in winter.

These are old houses in Capadocia (Turkey).
They are made of "tuff".
Christians built these houses during persecutions.
This is a stilt house.
You can see it in Thailand, Cambodia and New Guinea.
It's made of wood and palm leaves.
When it rains, the water doesn't enter the house.
This house is made of straw .
You can see it in Eritrea (Africa)
Nomad people live in this house.
Native Americans lived in this house.
It's a tepee.
It's made of sticks and buffalo skin or fabric.
This is an old tree house in the Philippines.
It's made of wood and straw.
It's a safe place from wild animals.

These houses are made of bricks and the walls are white. White colour rejects the sunrays. They have small windows and shutters. You can see them in South Italy, Greece and Portugal. This is a houseboat. It's made of wood and a special water plant "rushes". Bajau people in **South Asia** live in houseboats. Fisherman in Malaysia live in houses on the water. The house is made of wood of mangrove tree and straw. This is a Mongolian Yurt. It is a nomad house. It's made of wood and white cloth. The ceiling is open for the smoke to go out. This is an "igloo". It's made of **snow blocks**. You can see an igloo in North America, Alaska and Canada. The Inuit Eskimos live in igloos.
